

## CORN BELT PORTS ANNUAL PARTNERSHIP SUMMIT SAVE THE DATES 5-7 NOVEMBER 2025

**Who are Invited:** The Corn Belt Ports are the nation's leaders in modern, sustainable, rural, regional, multi-modal, inland, partnership ports. **DAY 1 (November 5): Green Marine Highway Initiative.** The purpose of the one-day event is to conduct collaboration to attract increased investment for our modern, rural, regional, multi-modal, inland ports, and support them in becoming economic development and decarbonization engines. The goal is to begin implementing a common, shared vision and regional strategy to reduce transportation costs and risks and deliver a cleaner, greener and more sustainable, resilient, and heathier ecosystem for the Illinois River (part of Marine Highway 55) and the Upper Mississippi River (Marine Highway 35). This effort to create port-aligned regional decarbonization engines supports the Blue Sky Maritime Coalition's *"Road Map to Net Zero Emissions."*

## DAY 2 (November 6): First Illinois River Cities and Towns Initiative (IRCTI) Annual
